Letter From the Pastor:

Standing Straight in a Crooked World

This summer and fall, the Revised Common Lectionary readings from the Old Testament are taking us on a wild ride through the voices of the prophets—Amos, Hosea, Isaiah, and others. These are not exactly your "feel good" scriptures. The prophets didn't usually show up to offer inspirational quotes or cozy reassurance. They came with hard truths, holy warnings, and thankfully, deep hope. They came to shake us awake.



The Sunday we gathered for Worship in the Park, the assigned reading would have been from Amos 7, a little-known corner of the Old Testament. In it, God shows the prophet Amos a vision of a plumb line, a tool used by builders to see if a wall is straight. God says, "I will test my people with this plumb line" (Amos 7:8, NLT).

Oof. That's uncomfortable. Because while it's one thing to build walls, it's another thing entirely to make sure they're actually straight. We can build ministries, habits, traditions, and budgets, but are they aligned with the heart of God? Are they held up by justice, mercy, humility, and love?

God's plumb line isn't a measuring stick of popularity or perfection—it's Jesus. His life, his love, his way of self-giving grace is the standard. And when we hold that plumb line up to our lives and our church, we might find some things need adjusting. The good news? God is not holding that plumb line to condemn us, but to restore us.

As we move through these prophetic readings, I invite you to listen with open ears and soft hearts. Let's not be afraid of the straight truth when it comes from the mouth of a loving God. Let's ask together:

- Are we building a faith that reflects Jesus?
- Are we listening to the cries of the hurting, the poor, the left-behind?
- Are we willing to be reshaped if it means we look more like Christ?

The prophets call us to more than comfort; they call us to courage. And the One who calls us by name walks beside us still. Let's keep building. Let's keep trusting. Let's keep aligning our lives with the love and grace of the Carpenter who gave his life for us all.

Call to Order by Terry Wallace

Roll Call- Attending: Terry Wallace, Linda Reetz, Tim Koch, Bob Prellwitz, Sandy Peschke, Heidi Schramer, Anita Lind, Sue Shemanski, Bonnie Kline and Pastor Rebekah

Terry provided Opening prayer.

Approval of Agenda – Linda added 2 items to the agenda (Outside the Box Outreach Committee Report and FFA request). Sandy added 1 item (approval of membership request). Anita moved to approve the amended Agenda. Bonnie seconded. Motion carried.

Secretary's Report – Terry moved to approve the Minutes of the May meeting as presented. Heidi seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report – Sandy reported that there is nothing new or unusual in the Treasurer's Report. She is gaining confidence in using the new RBC accounts and checkbook. We saved money on the Annual Fire Inspection this year as it cost \$80. We received the last \$1000 donation for the Scholarship Fund so that account has been moved to RBC. Bonnie moved to approve the Treasurer's Report. Second by Bob. Motion carried.

Officer and Standing Committee Reports

- President- Linda handed out a sign-up sheet for tasks needed for Worship in the Park scheduled for 10AM on July 13 and reminded us that we are responsible for providing the pies for the Polka and Pie Service on Aug. 24
- Pastor's Report Pastor has been on vacation this week and was happy to hear that her newly trained lay member (Amber Rozek) did a really great job leading worship this past Sunday. She was busy in May with graduations, a wedding, funeral and a baptism coming up in June. She has had the same members on the Mutual Ministry Committee for the last four years and is wondering about "changing out" a couple members as 2 have expressed interest in letting other members participate. Today she attended Senior Camp at Pine Lake with 7 members of First. She described a very enjoyable day and is hoping it can be done again next year with some Grace members in attendance.

Committees –

Fellowship and Caring – Met on June 8. They will be providing Fellowship for our new member Sunday on June 15. Primarily working on Worship in the Park planning and making sure there are sign-ups for Fellowship over the summer. They are also encouraging sending cards and making visits to church members and shut-ins over the summer. Their next meeting is Aug. 17 after church.

Building and Grounds – Bob distributed a written report. The purchase of the new stove was approved by the Congregation and the old stove will be removed June 20. Terry will take to be scrapped. June 23 the gas line will be re-routed and the stoves installed June 25. Scott Schweigert has volunteered to wash the church windows and Deanna Lueptow is looking into the cost of a new faucet for the food prep sink in the kitchen. Continue to watch for ceiling leaks in the sanctuary.

Christian Education- Anita shared that we are pleased to report that we sponsored 3 kids at church camp this summer.

Worship and Music – Heidi reported that Amber Rozek's family did a wonderful job leading worship this past Sunday. The "fill-in" pianist also plays the organ and was in on Monday playing for enjoyment. Heidi says it was beautiful and we may want to ask them to play at least one song on the organ if they are filling in for Jess again. Plans are in place for New Member Sunday, Worship in the Park, a service of hymns in July, First Lutheran's 150th Anniversary and the Polka and Pie Social.

Mission and Outreach – Tim Koch reported that he is going through the material shared with him by Craig C. and has the next four months set up for Missions. He needs to update the bulletin board and was told that the presenter for the Mission each month has been the one to change the Board in the past.

Finance Committee – Terry provided the minutes from the last Finance Committee Meeting and shared that the purchase of the new stoves was approved by the Congregation.

Investment Committee – Written Report provided. A virtual meeting with Steve Abrahamson of RBC in May showed that our combined (total) investments are up 4.24% year-to-date.

Outside the Box Outreach Committee-Heidi presented a written report from their 6/4/25 meeting. They are working on a schedule of disbursements and are still identifying needs in the community, along with other donation and volunteer opportunities.

Unfinished Business

- Data Pro Computer Update -Jason and his partner came a week ago and finished the job. The bill is paid.
- 1st Lutheran Anniversary Sign-up for duties/assistance was sent around by Linda.

New Business

- New Stoves Bob already reported.
- Approval of Language changes in continuing resolutions Terry moved to accept the two language changes in the continuing resolutions below. Second by Heidi. Motion carried.
 - 1) C13.10.A25: Add the sentence "Committee head to be decided among committee members based on expertise and willingness to serve that role"
 - 2) C13.10.B25: Add in #2.C. The chairperson of the Investment Committee, as well as the vice president, will be designated as authorized representatives to make trades and disbursements.
- New Members Sue moved to accept the request for membership of Christopher Bludau. Second by Heidi. Motion carried.
- FFA Request for businesses to fund support printing shirts was denied as this does not meet our Mission Statement and we are not a business.
- Tim asked re: old heavy-duty signs for church events he found in his storage shed and it was agreed we should keep them in the furnace room for now.

Closing Prayer offered by Pastor Rebekah.

Bonnie moved to adjourn the meeting. Second by Anita. Motion Carried.

"Population 485: Meeting Your Neighbors One Siren at a time" by Wisconsin author Michael Perry is the Grace Book Club's Choice for August.

After a decade away from his hometown, Michael Perry decides to return to the place he's always loved: New Auburn, Wisconsin (population 485). He discovers the local vigilante is a farmer's wife armed with a pistol and a Bible, the most senior member of the volunteer fire department is a cross-eyed butcher with one kidney and two ex-wives (both of whom work at the only gas station in town), and the back roads are haunted by the ghosts of children and farmers.

Unable to polka or repair his own pickup, his farm-boy hands gone soft after years of writing, Perry figures the best way to regain his credibility is to join the volunteer fire department. Against a backdrop of fires and tangled wrecks, bar fights and smelt feeds, Population: 485 is a comic and sometimes heartbreaking true tale leavened with quieter meditations on an overlooked America.
