#### From the Pastor:

In his book *Becoming A People of Grace: An Exposition of Ephesians*, Charles Swindoll shared this story:



Just before World War II, tragedy burned its way through the little town of Itasca, Texas, scorching the hearts of nearly every family who live there. The local school caught fire, and 263 children died in its heat.

Itasca's residents had neither the drive nor the resources to rebuild the school while the war raged on. But the end of the war brought hope, and soon the walls went up on a new building. The fire was not forgotten, however. This time, the school installed the finest sprinkler system technology could design.

When the project was complete, the townspeople came out in droves to see the facility. Honor students guided visitors through a tour, the highlight of which was the reassuring sight of sprinkler heads standing guard over the heads of the pupils. Parents sent their children to class with confidence, secure in the knowledge that a school fire would never again claim young lives in Itasca.

Just seven years later, though, the town had grown, and already the school needed to be enlarged. As workmen began construction, they discovered an appalling fact.

The best sprinkler system their money could buy had never been connected.

That story makes me shudder. But too many of us live every day with a disconnection of even greater proportions. We fail to connect to our source of power.

In Ephesians 1:15-23, Paul prays for the Ephesian believers that they may know God better, understand the hope of their calling, and grasp the incredible power available to them as followers of Christ. Paul urges them and us to connect deeply to God's power. It's not just about knowing it exists but actively plugging into it through prayer, worship, and a deepening relationship with God.

When we tap into God's power, we're not just accessing raw energy; we're embracing transformation. Our lives are illuminated with wisdom and understanding, strength and perseverance. Challenges that once seemed insurmountable become opportunities for growth and testimony. We become agents of God's love and grace in a world hungry for hope.

How are you connecting to God's power in your life? Are you daily seeking His presence, relying on His strength in times of need, and allowing His wisdom to guide your decisions? As you do, you can echo Paul's prayer, knowing that the same power that raised Christ from the dead is at work within us, shaping us into vessels of God's glory.

May you find inspiration to deepen your connection to God's power and live out your faith boldly, knowing that in Him, we are empowered beyond measure.

### GRACE ENGLISH CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING 6.10.24

President Linda called the meeting to order at 6:59pm.

Council members present; Pastor Rebekah, Linda Reetz, Terry Wallace, Sandy Peschke, Becky Olsen, Jody

Ziemann, Anita Lind, Craig Chovanec, Bob Prellwitz.

Perspective Council member; Heidi Schramer Congregation member present; Diane Toraason

**Opening Devotion.** Provided by Terry Wallace.

**Approval of the Agenda.** Jody made a motion to approve the agenda, seconded by Anita, motion carried.

**Audience Remarks.** Diane asked permission to speak during the new business item Shared Ministry Covenant, if needed. Linda gave permission to speak as needed.

**Secretary's Report.** May meeting minutes were circulated via email, corrections made. Motion made by Craig to accept report as written, seconded by Bob, motion carried.

**Treasurer's Report.** May financial report, including the check detail, provided. Sandy provided explanations to questions. Discussion held on Good Samaritan fund. Sandy will create a line item for the Good Samaritan Fund to provide clarity of the exact amount in this fund. Sandy also informed the council that the total amount of giving from January - May of 2024 is down \$5,068.00 compared to the same time period in 2023. Linda provided the council with a copy of the current investment profile. Motion made by Anita to accept the report, seconded by Jody, motion carried.

**President's Report.** Linda created, handed out and discussed a document entitled 'Ground Rules if Conflict Arises'. This document was initiated by Cathy Cowling and was a topic of discussion at the council retreat. Linda created, handed out and discussed a document entitled 'The Shared Interests of Grace English Lutheran Church and First Lutheran Church'.

**Investment Committee.** Linda presented the Investment Committee's purpose and functions language, first reading. The Investment Committee language will be added to our Constitution as Continuing Resolution C13.10.B24. Discussion held. Linda will convey council's recommendations of changes to the committee for consideration prior to final council approval.

**Buildings and Grounds.** Linda discussed that the Buildings and Grounds Committee has completed a 5-10 year maintenance plan for our building, thanking Bob for his work in completing this plan.

**Pastor's Report.** Pastor Rebekah reported Pastoral Acts of visitation to Marian Ryan and two members at First. She also included a list of ongoing activities and meetings. Reporting she will be on vacation July 11-17th. Pastor and Jessica are working on a service of favorite hymns and scripture, including the history behind the hymns, for the July 14th worship service.

#### **Committee Reports.**

**Fellowship and Caring.** Jody reported no 6.9.24 meeting due to the congregation workshop following service. Next meeting is planned for 7.14.24, following service. She reported that the immediate responsibility for the group is to ensure Sunday fellowship is provided.

**Buildings and Grounds.** Bob reported ongoing lawn maintenance. Reported that another Ash tree may need removal in the near future. The parking lot cracks were resealed, some may need further filling and he will contact the company regarding additional needs. Carpet cleaning will be completed on 7.29 and 7.30. Janitors will try to remove spots from a few pew cushions. He reported that he has completed the 5-10 year maintenance plan for the building and has given the data to Linda. Next meeting is 8.12.24 at 6pm.

Christian Education. No report. Anita reported no upcoming meeting date for the group.

Worship and Music. No report. Heidi reported that they may hold a meeting in July.

Mission and Outreach. Craig reported that the mission of the month is Disaster Relief. He reported that this mission is one that our members respond to the most. In recent years we have focused on tornadoes twice, 2011 and 2017 were two of the deadliest years in history. He reported that in 2017 a tornado killed 71 in Alabama, 156 in Missouri (injuring another 900) and a tornado in Chetek, Wisconsin carved a path of destruction 83 miles long. Just a few weeks ago we had tornado sirens in Berlin, while we had no tornado many others were not so fortunate. The rebuilding process following tornadoes is long and challenging. The ELCA Disaster Relief brings hope, healing and renewal to many whose lives have been affected by disasters.

**Finance Committee.** Terry provided a written summary of the recent joint Finance Committee meeting held with First. The next meeting for Grace's Finance Committee is 7.23.24 at 1pm.

#### **Unfinished Business.**

**Joint Parish Council.** The councils have an upcoming meeting on 6.17.24 at First Lutheran at 630pm. Membership Committee. Becky reported that the group plans to meet closer to the end of the year to ensure accuracy of our annual congregation membership reporting to the ELCA, due 3.1.25.

**Christian Education Committee.** The Christian Education Committee's language was read for the second time. Motion made by Anita to accept the new Christian Education Committee language, seconded by Terry, motion carried. This committee will be identified in the Constitution as Continuing Resolution C13.10.A24.

#### New Business.

**Resignation.** Mary Gropp resigned from the council position, Worship and Music Liaison. Motion made by Jody to accept resignation, seconded by Craig, motion carried. Thank you note sent to Mary for her service.

**Appointment of the council Worship and Music Liaison.** Heidi Schramer volunteered to fill the position. Motion made by Craig to appoint Heidi to the position, seconded by Terry, motion carried. Heidi will fill this position until the next annual meeting.

Renaming of the General Investment Fund to the Capital Improvement Fund. Discussion held on the renaming of the fund. Following a lengthy discussion Becky made a motion to table the item until the July council meeting, to allow time for the gathering of more information, seconded by Sandy, motion carried. Terry will reach out to Steve Abrahamson for additional information to include the benefits and risks of changing this fund. The general fund will no longer receive \$550.00/month from RBC if the change of this fund is approved. Shared Ministry Covenant. Discussion held at a recent meeting with First Lutheran, (representing Grace were Linda and Terry). Linda informed the council that First representatives have agreed to a 55% - 45% shared ministry agreement and that their representatives would take this figure to their council for consideration. Motion made by Terry to change Grace's financial portion of the Shared Ministry Covenant to 55% (Grace) with First Lutheran carrying the 45% of the shared finance, and to adopt line item # 7 milage changes, seconded by Heidi, motion carried. This approved motion will be discussed at the Joint Parish Council meeting on 6.17.24. If the changes to the Shared Ministry Covenant are approved by both councils (Grace and First Lutheran) these changes will become effective on 7.1.24.

**Memorial Funds Form.** Discussion held on a new form designed to assist families with bequests. Sandy will add additional 'areas' of designating to the form and present it at our July meeting.

**Congregation workshop.** Discussion held on the 6.9.24 workshop. Some members that attended stated that it was a positive event. No further workshops have been scheduled at this time.

**Council Retreat.** Discussion held on the event. No further action taken.

Closing Prayer. Provided by Pastor Rebekah.

**Adjournment.** Motion made by Jody to adjourn, seconded by Anita, motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 8:46pm.
