REGULAR GRACE ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH CONGREGATIONAL COUNCIL MEETING – FELLOWSHIP HALL 11 Monday, June 13, 2022

Present: Bill Bartlett, Cindy Wallace, Tricia Prellwitz, Becky Guden, Jody Ziemann, Sue Shemanski, Matt Dretske, Linda Reetz, Craig Chovanec and Pastor Rebekah Tarras.

President Bill Bartlett called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and Linda Reetz led us in opening prayer.

The May Council minutes were presented. Linda Reetz made a motion to accept the minutes; Cindy Wallace seconded the motion. Motion approved.

Ministry Reports:

Pastor Rebekah's report listed her activities in May which included for Grace 1 baptism; and 1 Affirmation of Baptism. She did note that she will be taking vacation June 17 to June 24 and Pastor Becki Kindschi is on call for any emergencies. Also, Pastor may be taking the week of August 29 through September 5 as vacation with Intern Kathy leading worship.

May Treasurer's report was handed out by Cindy Wallace. Craig Chovanec made a motion to accept this report as presented; Jody Ziemann seconded. Motion approved. The May Check Detail was reviewed; Matt Dretske made a motion to approve all checks as written; Sue Shemanski seconded. Motion approved.

Bill Bartlett presented an update on all investments. In May, the investments had gained back some that was lost but now in June, we may have lost that too. Still quite volatile and in a downward trend. The Investment Committee has approved Steve Abrahamson of RBC as our new consultant.

Matt Dretske handed out a list from Buildings & Grounds Committee of projects completed in the past month and those still waiting to be completed which include cleaning out the grease traps and installing the 3 new paper towel dispensers.

Sue Shemanski gave an update from the Christian Ed Committee that they met in May and have planned out the tentative schedule for the 2022/2023 school year with Sunday School starting the third Sunday in September.

Fellowship & Caring committee report was presented by Jody Ziemann. Jody advised that the committee would like a Master Event List to better plan or coordinate events; Sunday Fellowship during summer will be very basic but still need members to sign up to sponsor; June 26 will be Legacy Sunday to honor members that have been at Grace for a long period of time and the 40th anniversary of being in the current building. July 17 will be the joint service with First at Riverside Park along with a catered meal by Crossroads. August 28 will be our Polka Sunday featuring Larry Albright band and again have a pie social after service with a request that council provides the pies. This committee is always open to any other ideas or suggestions.

Tricia Prellwitz reported from the Worship & Music Committee that everything is set during Pastor's vacation to do the Service of the Word on June 19. A communion update was given that there will be an option to have communion at the rail once a month starting in October. Also, there may be a possibility to use a choir member with a mic to sing hymns during the service so the radio and Facebook listeners can better hear the song.

Craig Chovanec reported from the Missions & Outreach Committee June will be the same Mission of the Month of Funds for Leaders with Compassion Child being the Mission for July & August. But further in the meeting, this may change for coming months as needs have changed. Also, they will be looking at encouraging Berlin Food Pantry donations.

Old Business:

Pastor Rebekah gave an update on the Pastoral Internship. A Lay Internship Committee has been formed with members from Grace and First Lutheran. Intern Kathy will start August 1 with the rite being performed on August 7. Office space at Grace is being created in the east wing; Kathy does plan on attending events coming up this summer to get to know everyone plus she will write an introduction of herself in upcoming newsletter.

A volunteer coordinator position was discussed again with the position being called "Ministry Assistant". The position would be a paid position with around 10 hours per week, with duties of calling for volunteers to help with various events; help with wedding parties and with funeral directors in the church. Sue Shemanski made a motion to develop this job description and pursue to hire a Ministry Assistance; Tricia Prellwitz seconded. Motion approved.

A list of responses from the online survey that have been received so far asking for input on which direction members would like to see Grace pursue. 18 members have completed the survey, so a paper form will be handed out to members the next couple of services to better facilitate the survey.

The idea of a programmable outdoor sign was discussed to hopefully be in the same area our current sign is on the corner of Oak & Memorial. It could advertise our services, Soul Food and any other upcoming events at Grace. Council decided to start gathering the information needed to do this; including the cost, programming via wi-fi, city ordinances, etc.

New Business:

Paige Soper, granddaughter of member Barb Tollakson, has brought a request to help sponsor her during her year term with Chi Alpha Christian Fellowship at UW-Oshkosh. This fellowship would help bring the gospel of Jesus to students and other Christian based outreach programs. She is currently looking for donations to help her with the \$2,000 monthly budget. Linda Reetz made a motion that Grace should send her \$100/month for the next year to help her on this mission; Jody Ziemann seconded. Motion approved. Craig will make this a Mission of the Month to help her collect more donations and will contact Paige to do a presentation to the congregation.

Bill Bartlett advised that Grace may be at the point of outsourcing the cleaning crew as the volunteer group is dwindling. An announcement will be made at upcoming services requesting more volunteers with the possibility of having two alternate crews. If not, council will start looking for a person/persons or company that will come in to clean and this would be a paid position or expense.

Pastor Rebekah led us in Closing Prayer.

Linda Reetz made a motion to adjourn; Matt Dretske seconded. Motion approved. Meeting adjourned at 8:25 p.m.


"The heavens declare the glory of God..."
