

#### Letter From the Pastor:

A few weeks ago, I spent 2 days participating in the Global Leadership Summit. It was two days packed with teaching and encouragement from leaders in ministry, business, and beyond. One particular message has stuck with me, and it came from a simple little verse in Acts 18.

The verse was about a man named Apollos. He had been working with the church in Ephesus and sensed God was calling him to move on to Greece. His fellow believers blessed him and sent him off with letters of recommendation. And then Acts 18:27 says, "When he arrived there, he proved to be a great benefit to those who, by God's grace, had believed" (NLT).

That verse grabbed my attention: "He proved to be a great benefit to the believers there."

Apollos didn't try to make a name for himself, gather fans, or leave behind a monument. He simply showed up in a way that blessed others. His ministry encouraged and strengthened the believers. Another translation even says, "he was an advantage to others."

I think this verse might be my new personal mission statement. I know that I am not perfect (just ask my family). I make mistakes - plenty of them! But at the end of the day, my hope is that my ministry here at First and Grace is a benefit to the believers.

But here's the thing: this isn't just about pastors. This verse is for all of us. As followers of Jesus, each of us is called to be a benefit to others. To encourage one another, to lift each other up, and to help strengthen the faith of those around us.

Hebrews 10:24 puts it this way: "Let us think of ways to motivate one another to acts of love and good works." That's what being a benefit looks like - helping each other walk more closely with Jesus, offering hope when faith feels shaky, and showing love in a world that is starving for it.

So here's my encouragement to you this month: ask yourself, *How can I be a benefit to someone else's faith?* Maybe it's praying with someone, or writing a quick note of encouragement. Maybe it's finding a new way to serve at church, or simply showing up with kindness.

Apollos may not be the most famous name in Scripture, but his quiet example of faithful encouragement changed lives. And God can use you and me in the very same way.

Let's be a benefit to each other, to our community, and to the world for the sake of the gospel, for the strength of Christ's church, and for the glory of Jesus.

### Grace English Lutheran Church Congregation Council Meeting Minutes July 14, 2025

Call to Order by Terry Wallace

Roll Call- Attending: Terry Wallace, Bob Prellwitz, Sandy Peschke, Heidi Schramer, Anita Lind, Sue

Shemanski, Bonnie Kline and Pastor Rebekah

Absent: Linda Reetz and Tim Koch

Terry provided Opening prayer.

Approval of Agenda – Anita moved to approve the agenda as presented. Sue seconded. Motion carried.

Secretary's Report – Terry suggested we start putting the draft of the Minutes on the kiosk again. Sandy agreed to do so. Bonnie moved to approve June Minutes as printed. Bob seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report – Sue moved to approve the Treasurer's Report as presented. Second by Heidi. Motion carried.

Officer and Standing Committee Reports

• President-No report as Linda is on vacation

Pastor's Report – Pastor provided a written report for our review. Most importantly she suggested considering the option of moving to the Narrative Lectionary (vs. the Revised Lectionary we are presently using), possibly starting in December. This came about as a result of a discussion at the Lay Preaching Class where participants were asking about the present Lectionary and why it isn't more chronological, what the connections are between the readings each week (they aren't connected) and why we don't hear about many of the Bible readings in worship. After explanation and discussion, Anita made a motion to switch to the Narrative Lectionary starting in Dec with the Gospels. Second by Bonnie. Motion carried. There was discussion re: whether or not we should announce this to Congregation or just start it? To be determined.

#### • Committees –

Fellowship and Caring – Bonnie shared that they haven't met since June meeting, but that the summer Fellowship schedule is filled. Their next meeting is Aug. 17 after church.

Building and Grounds – Bob distributed a written report. The new stove has been installed successfully and the old one scrapped. We discussed the problem of not being able to open the door going outside at the east side kitchen area entrance (old Youth Room) when it is hot and humid. Bob is getting tired of being asked about it! New door would be prohibitively expensive for a problem that only happens a short time in the year. We decided maybe it could be ground down a little to make it close easier as it has many layers of paint on it.

Christian Education- Anita shared that we helped sponsor 3 kids at church camp this summer (Pine Lake). This Committee will be meeting July 21<sup>st</sup> to establish a Sunday School calendar for the coming year. Sue threw out the idea of hiring a part-time paid Christian Ed. Supervisor to develop and implement programming for youth, adults and families. Would we attract more young people if we had someone dedicated to that role?

Worship and Music – Worship in the park went really well. 85 people ate and more attended the service and couldn't stay to eat. Heidi said there was some confusion re: who was in charge and next time it should just be the Council. Plans are in place for a service of hymns in July, First Lutheran's 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary and the Polka and Pie Social (Council is responsible for pies, serving and clean up).

Mission and Outreach – Tim was not here to report, but it was noted that Paige Soper presented about Compassion Child this past Sunday (Mission of the Month).

Finance Committee – Terry provided the minutes from the last Finance Committee Meeting and shared that there will not be a Finance Comm Mtg in July.

Investment Committee – Written Report provided. There was an approximate \$50,000 gain over all accounts invested in June 2025.

Outside the Box Outreach Committee-Heidi presented a written report from their 6/25/25 meeting. They are purchasing boots, snowpants, etc and we discussed taking the whole amount of \$6500 out of Leonard Jones Fund now to keep at Fortifi Bank for easier access as they purchase supplies for their outreach activities.

#### **Unfinished Business**

- The stove total with installation was \$8375. The Women's Group bought a new shelving rack and Soul Food purchased trays for cooking.
- 1<sup>st</sup> Lutheran Anniversary Sign-up for duties/assistance Reminder.

#### **New Business**

- EMT Association Request Sandy will make copies to put on table in Narthex if anyone wants to make a personal donation
- Sandy was provided a quote for the church garbage pick up once per month by Waste Mgt. and the quote was \$31.54/mo. We are presently paying GFL \$139/mo. She will do a little more exploration re: hidden fees, etc and we may decide to switch to Waste Mgt.
- Men's Steak Fry- Aug. 20<sup>th</sup>- Location to be determined.

Closing Prayer – Recited Lord's Prayer together.

Bonnie moved to adjourn the meeting. Second by Anita. Motion Carried.


