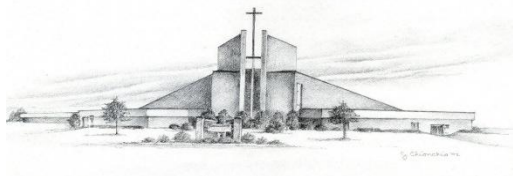

The Season of Advent

Every year, Advent invites us to pause and prepare, not just for Christmas morning, but for Christ who comes to us again and again with grace, mercy, and sometimes a holy disruption or two. This season isn't only about counting down the days. It's about opening our hearts to the One who already dwells among us.



This year, our worship together will follow a journey shaped around four themes: **hope, peace, joy, and love**. These aren't just candles on a wreath. They are gifts God grows within us as we wait, watch, and welcome Christ.

We begin the season with Hope. Isaiah cries out, "*Oh, that you would burst from the heavens and come down!*" (Isaiah 64:1). If you've ever prayed, "Lord, could you please hurry up?" you're in good company. Hope isn't pretending everything is fine. Hope is trusting that God is working, even when we can't yet see the ending. It's anticipation rooted in gratitude, not because life is perfect, but because God is faithful.

On the second Sunday of Advent, we turn to one of the most powerful declarations in Scripture: "*The Word became human and made His home among us.*" (John 1:14). God doesn't stay distant. God moves into the neighborhood, into our ordinary, our messy, our real life. This is the heart of Peace, not quiet circumstances, but God's presence.

The third Sunday of Advent brings Joy. Joy doesn't depend on everything going smoothly. Joy comes from knowing that God is with us. The angels said, "*I bring you good news that will bring great joy to all people.*" (Luke 2:10, NLT). That "all people" includes us—whether we're feeling merry or a little messy this season.

This Sunday we will also share our Christmas program, *Sounding Joy*, where we hear and tell the story together through scripture, song, and the voices of storytellers young and old.

The fourth Sunday of Advent focuses on Love. Not sentimental, greeting-card love, but real, self-giving love. "*God showed God's great love for us by sending Christ...*" (Romans 5:8, NLT). Jesus is love made visible.

This week, the choir leads us with the Cantata, offering music that proclaims the gospel straight into our bones.

Finally, we gather on Christmas Eve to celebrate the hope, peace, joy, and love fulfilled in the birth of Christ, Immanuel, God with us, then and now.

October 13, 2025**

Call to Order by Linda Reetz

Roll Call- Attending: Terry Wallace, Linda Reetz, Sandy Peschke, Heidi Schramer, Anita Lind, Sue Shemanski, Bonnie Kline, Tim Koch and Bob Prellwitz

Absent: Pastor Rebekah

Terry provided Opening devotion.

Approval of Agenda – Anita moved to approve the amended agenda as presented. Sandy seconded. Motion carried.

Secretary's Report – Anita moved to approve September minutes as printed. Bonnie seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report – No changes to report. Sue moved to approve the Treasurer's Report as presented. Second by Heidi. Motion carried.

Officer and Standing Committee Reports

- President-Linda shared some upcoming events:
 - Nov. 17 Parish Council (Officers) hosted by Grace
 - Dec 7 -decorate church after service (decided to cut tree at 9AM on Dec. 3rd) Christian Ed will provide a lunch on the 7th.
 - Dec. 24 Christmas Eve 4PM here and 6:30PM at 1st
 - Feb. 8, 2026 Annual Meeting
- 2026 Budget- Linda handed out copies of the Budget vs Actual Spending report to date for committees to use in preparing their budgets. Committees should submit their budgets for 2026 by the November Council meeting to be included in the overall church budget.
- Mutual Ministry Comm -Looking for 2 members of Grace to replace outgoing members. Send possible names to Linda.
- Nominating Comm- Should begin meeting and coming up with candidates for President, Vice Pres., Treasurer and Mission and Christian Ed representatives on Council, plus 3 names for the new Nominating Committee for 2026 (2 should be outgoing Council members)
- Endowment Committee also needs replacement suggestions
- Narrative Lectionary provides an opportunity for more Bible study groups that could be lead by congregants. Linda will make an announcement in church Sunday asking if anyone is interested in leading a study.
- Pastor's Report- Pastor provided an email report as she could not be here tonight. Her report included the activities she has participated in this past month including one baptism and one funeral, along with starting Confirmation which is challenging as one student is participating online.
- Committees –
 - Fellowship and Caring – Bonnie shared that they met on the 14th of Sept. They are going to begin honoring birthdays and anniversaries once per month during the first service of the month. They will be sending cards to shut-ins in Nov. and Dec and asked if Sunday School could make 12 for them in Nov. They are also looking for ideas other than just food to take to shut-ins. Linda suggested bath or personal care items for the women. Mtg again on 11/9.
 - Building and Grounds – Bob reported that Bob Moriarity has been called to check on the refrigerator as the temp is fluctuating a lot. We do not think that he has come yet. Fall clean-up day went really well. Fall lawn care and leaf clean up will continue, including edging of sidewalks. The snowblower will be prepped for winter.

Christian Education- Anita shared that Sunday School continues to go well with between 5-10 kids attending. Christian Ed. Is planning to host a monthly meal/activity and devotion starting Wed. Oct. 22nd. This will be from 5:30-7PM and the public is welcome. The activity will be decorating pumpkins and cookies. C.E. volunteered to plan a lunch on Dec. 7th following the church decorating and will host a Christmas Program during the service on Dec. 14 similar to what we did last year ("Paper Bag" program).

Worship and Music – Heidi handed out an outline of upcoming dates to remember. The Thanksgiving Service will be at the Methodist church at 7PM on Tuesday night before Thanksgiving. The Cantata will be Dec. 17 and 21. On Dec. 21st at 6:30PM will be the Blue Christmas service. Christmas Eve service will be at 4PM at Grace.

Mission and Outreach – Tim reported that this committee will be meeting this coming Sunday to plan for 2026.

Finance Committee – Terri reported that the Insurance costs for the church are increasing by 7-8% for the next year. He handed out the Minutes of the Sept 16 Finance Comm. Mtg. which explained that we chose Health Ins for Pastor with a higher deductible, but including an HSA which we will contribute \$100 to monthly (divided with First). The premium is going up about \$59 for Grace

Investment Committee – Terry provided an account summary of all accounts showing an approximate \$18,800 total gain in the last month.

Outside the Box Outreach Committee- Donated 78 pairs of snowpants, 84 pairs of boots and 4 coats to the Boys and Girls Club!

Unfinished Business- None

New Business

- Pastor's Health Ins for 2026 has been chosen. See above under Finance Comm.
- Oshkosh Conference Assembly at Ripon Grace Lutheran Church on October 18, 2025 from 9-12. Sue S. and Tim K. will be representing Grace.
- We discussed doing another church directory-decided to have it as an agenda item for the congregation to weigh in on at the Annual meeting.
- Model Constitution Changes- Anita moved to approve the changes in the October 2025 version of the Model Constitution so that copies can be distributed to the Congregation in Dec. for review and a vote will be done at the Annual meeting. Bob seconded. Motion carried.
- Celebration Sundays – we will start recognizing monthly anniversaries and birthdays on the first Sunday of the month during announcements. This will start Nov. 2nd. We will continue with same Fellowship plan (whatever the sign-up person provides).
- We discussed having one system for Sign-up genius for flowers, bulletins, readers, etc. Jess suggested an I-pad, but older members may want something larger. Terry and Tim volunteered to meet with Jess along with the office staff, Penny and Sandy, to review options and make a recommendation to Council.
- Trex recycling Project- Linda shared a handout describing a project where if an organization can collect 1000# of plastic recyclables, the Trex Co, will donate a bench made out of recycled plastics. We decided to apply and even if we don't collect 1000# (in 1 year), we will be providing a good service for the environment and community. However, we do want to try to collect 1000# to prove to Jerry Reetz we can do it! Linda will make the application and we'll see what happens.

Closing Prayer – Recited Lord's Prayer together.

Bonnie moved to adjourn the meeting. Second by Tim. Motion Carried.

Endowment Fund

The Endowment Fund was set up in 2019 by the Church Council and is monitored by a professional investment firm and by the Endowment committee. Available funds must meet a performance benchmark to be eligible to be dispersed. It also shows that we are practicing good, safe use of donated money.

- Endowment funds come from bequests in wills, charitable remainder trusts, transfer of property, and life income gifts.
- The Endowment Fund is not intended to generate revenue for general operating expenses.
- It is set up to be a source of perpetual contributions to charities and ministries.
- The amount available is 4% of the year-end market value of the last three years.
- These funds will be used exclusively for religious, charitable, and educational purposes with local community needs given a priority.

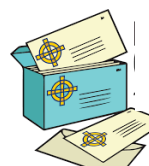

A few helpful notes:

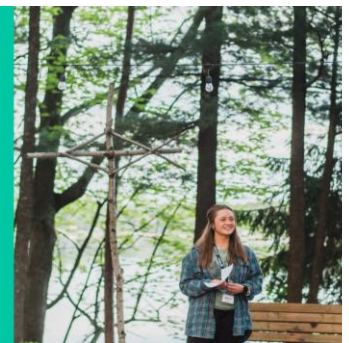
