From the Pastor:

Many of the spiritual practices traditionally observed during Lent stem from the gospel reading for Ash Wednesday from Matthew 6:1-6, 16-18. These practices include worship prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. I offered some suggestions on worship, prayer, and fasting last month. This month, I want to give you some other ideas that you might choose to experiment with during Lent this year.



Almsgiving is the act of donating money, food, or other items to the poor or needy. Almsgiving helps us experience giving freely, which can lead us to freedom from the obsession with possessing, and from the fear of losing what we have. Almsgiving is more than just charity; it is sacrificial giving that includes prayer and fasting. As we help our brothers and sisters who live in poverty, we become more connected to God and to one another. Someone told me that when they went grocery shopping, they purchased two of everything and gave all of the second items away. Another person shared that during Lent they gave a donation to a different charity every day. I had one friend who liked to eat out regularly. During Lent, she gave \$100 tips to the servers as a way of observing almsgiving. Others have doubled their church donations for the season. Yet another idea I've seen is the practice of eliminating one item from your closet or home every day during Lent. One mother told me that she had each of her children participate in this one too. How might you practice almsgiving this Lent?

Another spiritual discipline is confession. You might choose to end each day taking time to honestly and gently evaluate how you have loved God and neighbor – or not – and how the Spirit might be calling you to do better.

Mediation might be something to practice. This is intentionally making space in our lives to focus on God's faithful and sacrificial love for us.

I want to encourage you to intentionally pick one new practice for Lent this year. May you find that practice to be a gift as it draws you closer to God and helps you prepare to celebrate the greatest event of our church year, Easter.

REGULAR GRACE ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH CONGREGATIONAL COUNCIL MEETING – FELLOWSHIP HALL Monday, January 10, 2022

Present: Bill Bartlett, Cindy Wallace, Tricia Prellwitz, Becky Guden, Sue Shemanski, Linda Reetz, and Pastor Rebekah Tarras. Matt Dretske and Conrad Falk were absent.

President Bill Bartlett called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and Linda Reetz led us in opening prayer.

The December Council minutes were presented. Linda Reetz made a motion to accept the minutes; Cindy Wallace seconding the motion. Motion approved.

Ministry Reports:

Pastor Rebekah presented her written report listing her activities in the past month. She advised that Confirmation classes will be moved to virtual upon the request of the confirmands families. Also, she noted that the attendance to High School Youth Bible study is very low, Pastor requested to suspend that activity for now. This will be reviewed again and possibly scheduled for a special event or go to a quarterly event. The National Youth Convention in July was then discussed with our youth and Sue Shemanski will follow up with families to see if there is any interest.

The December Treasurer's Report from Cindy Wallace was reviewed. Sue Shemanski made a motion to approve as submitted; Linda Reetz seconded. Motion approved. The December Check Detail was also reviewed and Linda Reetz made a motion to approve all checks as written; Sue Shemanski seconded. Motion approved.

Bill Bartlett advised that the Buildings & Grounds Committee has been busy keeping up with the snow shoveling; and that all heaters in the entryways are turned on and working.

No Missions and Outreach report but the list of proposed monthly Missions was handed out as prepared by Craig Chovanec.

Sue Shemanski handed out the Christian Ed Committee report. She highlighted their discussion on the National Youth Convention in July; and possibility of a future Mission trip in 2023. Carrie McCarthy will now Chair this committee in 2022.

No Fellowship and Caring report.

Tricia Prellwitz presented her report from the Worship & Music Committee. She advised that the new technology is doing well and training is still being done; and the services in December went well. Several upcoming events were discussed which included suspending choir rehearsals and performances due to COVID for now; Lenten Schedule was presented with "Services By My Hand For My Sake" as the program to be used. Tentatively a joint Palm Sunday service will be held at Grace with a Brunch to follow; Maundy Thursday service will at First Lutheran and Good Friday service at Grace.

Bill Bartlett handed out the Investment spreadsheet on the 3 investment funds. December showed a rebound as predicted and all investments are doing well.

Old Business:

Council reviewed our current COVID policy and procedures; and if any changes should be made with the current high case numbers. After a long discussion, council agreed to keep our current procedures and felt members can

make their own decision. There will be an announcement at the beginning of next Sunday's service outlining the council's thoughts and ask for all members to give their opinion.

The Wedding Policy & Planning Guide was presented with updates and revisions. After the council reviewed the booklet, Linda Reetz made a motion to approve the revised Wedding Guide; Cindy Wallace seconded. Motion approved.

New Business:

Earlier in the meeting, Jean Dretske of the Audit Committee had presented the committees findings after the audit performed by her, Henry Stark and Craig Chovanec. The report consists of recommendations regarding the handling of outstanding checks; Certificates of Insurance from outside organizations, contractors or vendors using our building for non-church use; retain software backup off site; and do an inventory update. Council will follow-up with these recommendations and thanked Jean and the committee for their efforts.

The 2022 proposed budget was handed out for the council to review and discuss. Linda Reetz made a motion to approve the proposed 2022 budget; Tricia Prellwitz seconded. Motion approved. This budget will be presented at the Congregational Annual Meeting.

Bill Bartlett proposed a change in the wording of C13.10.A21, a Continuing Resolution in the Constitution regarding a Finance Committee. The proposed new continuing resolution would assign the duties of the current Finance Committee to the Executive Committee. The Finance Committee would be eliminated. Sue Shemanski made a motion to accept this change. It was seconded by Linda Reetz. Motion approved.

Council has approved the following members for the 2022 Audit Committee: Tom McCarthy for a 3 year term; Jean Dretske for a 2 year term and Henry Stark for a 1 year term. Pastor Rebekah made a motion to accept these members for the Audit Committee; Tricia Prellwitz seconded. Motion approved. Terms will be staggered in the coming years as stated in the Constitution.

The Annual Meeting and agenda are all set; committee chairpersons were reminded to get their annual reports in soon to be included in the booklet. In the future, a reminder will be sent out in December.

Pastor Rebekah led us in Closing Prayer.

Linda Reetz made a motion to adjourn; Sue Shemanski seconded. Motion approved. Meeting adjourned at 8:35p.m.

Mission of the Month - Crossways Camping Ministries

The three camps of Crossways Camping Ministries at their current locations began in the 1940s.

<u>Waypost Camp</u> is the oldest continuously-operating site. Originally called Central Wisconsin Lutheran Bible Camp, it opened in 1942 due to the supply and demand of camping facilities for its member churches during World War II. In 1963, it became known as Waypost on Mission Lake when it merged with <u>Imago</u> <u>Dei Village</u> as part of the Wisconsin Association of Bible Camps of the American Lutheran Church. The association's name was changed to Imago Dei Ministries in 1975.

<u>Pine Lake Camp</u> was purchased in 1947 by a group of churches that had rented facilities for camp at Green Lake since 1929. It was known as Pine Lake Bible Camp and was a part of the Wisconsin/Upper Michigan Synod of the Lutheran Church in America. It shared leadership with Fortune Lake Bible Camp in Upper Michigan for many years and was operated through the synod office in Milwaukee until 1982.

In 1991, the Pine Lake Bible Camp Association and Imago Dei Ministries merged into one single camp corporation called Crossways Lutheran Camping Ministries and became a part of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.

Today, Crossways Lutheran Camping Ministries is an association of nearly 190 congregations, most of which are a part of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, and is governed by an elected Board of Directors.

A mixture of full-time and part-time staff keep the ministry of Crossways Camping Ministries moving forward throughout the entire year with programs and facilities for people of all ages.
