- 2 or 3 bath size bars of soap (8 9 ounces total in original wrapping)
- 1 sturdy comb

Mission of the Month - Berlin Food Pantry


The Berlin Food Pantry has been providing assistance to residence of Berlin and adjacent zip codes, since 2017. Prior to that it was "Berlin Emergency Food Pantry" and was a consortium of churches, housed at Grace Lutheran on Huron Street, before moving to the Federated Church.

In 2017, River Shores Community Church donated 3000 square feet in their building, and Grace Lutheran donated \$15,000 toward start-up expenses.

Food insecurity has been on the increase in our community, and we feel this is an important local mission to support. With children out of school during the summer, the need increases as they are not receiving meals at school. They currently distribute 2000 pounds of grocery items weekly, serving approximately 60 families.


