

### From the Pastor:

As the days grow shorter and winter's chill settles in, the season of Advent emerges, ushering in a time of reflection, anticipation, and joy.

Advent marks the beginning of the church liturgical year. It is often thought of as a season of waiting and preparation. So what are we waiting for? For what are we preparing? On the one hand, we are getting ready to celebrate the birth of Christ. And at the same time, Advent reminds us of not just a historical moment,



but a new reality, a new encounter. The Isaiah reading for Advent 1 begins with a plea "O that you would tear open the heavens and come down" (Isaiah 64:1a, NRSV). God, we know you are present; our faith tells us that you are here. But we need to know it beyond a shadow of a doubt. Shake us up so that we can be certain again. We've begun to wonder; we've begun to doubt. So, do it again, Lord. Do it again.

Central to the Advent season is the lighting of the Advent wreath. Each candle represents a different aspect of the season - hope, peace, joy, and love. The lighting of these candles, one by one, symbolizes the progression of the season.

Beyond the lighting of candles, many people celebrate Advent with an Advent calendar. Each day leading up to Christmas, a door or compartment is opened, revealing a verse of scripture, or an inspirational quote. This daily ritual fosters a sense of mindfulness, encouraging individuals to savor the present moment and appreciate the beauty in the ordinary. We have calendars available if you don't already have one.

ELCA World Hunger had provided copies of an Advent Study guide. I encourage you to pick up a copy and use it each week throughout the Advent season. The guide is designed to help you notice in scripture, story, and reflection, where and how God is at work.

May the season of Advent be a time of anticipation and joy for you and your family.

#### GRACE ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES 10.9.23

Council members present; Heidi Schramer, De Anna Lueptow, Cindy Wallace, Becky Olsen, Pastor Rebekah, Sue Shemanski, Jody Ziemann, Bob Prellwitz, Craig Chovanec. Absent Gene Hess. President Heidi Schramer called the meeting to order at 7:15pm. Vice President De Anna Lueptow gave the opening prayer.

**Approval of the Agenda**. Heidi Schramer requested the Damascus Road Project be added and Sue Shemanski requested the nominating committee be added to the agenda. Motion made by Sue Shemanski to approve the agenda with the additions, seconded by Cindy Wallace, motion carried.

#### Concerns from the audience. None

**Secretary's Report**. September Secretary's Report circulated via email for review. Motion made by Cindy Wallace to accept the report as written, seconded by Jody Ziemann, motion carried.

**Treasurer's Report.** September Treasurer's Report and check detail circulated via email and paper copies. Investment profile not available at the time of the meeting, will plan to review at the November meeting. Motion made by Sue Shemanski to accept reports as written, seconded by De Anna Lueptow, motion carried.

#### **Unfinished Business.**

**Extending Soul Food Type Events.** Discussion held on planning future events. Ideas included hosting an event prior to a less attended high school event, such as a wrestling match. Suggestion made to check the school calendar prior to planning an event. Will table items until the next meeting for further discussion.

**Holy Conversation Document.** Discussion held on the question, What is your dream for your church? **Inactive Members.** Discussion held on responses received from contacting inactive members prior to the Drawn to the Word Service. Council members agreed to continue to reach out to inactive members at a minimum of yearly. Members will reach out to members again prior to our Christmas Service. Planning an updated directory was also an idea shared to include our inactive membership. Pastor Rebekah encouraged council members to pray for those inactive members on our lists.

Roy Chadwick Memorial Plaque. Tabled until the next meeting to allow for additional information.

**Drawn to the Word Service**. Thank you cards received and read. Members in agreement with the suggested placement of painting.

**Ecumenical Service.** Service is 11.21.23 at 7pm. Council members will serve as greeters, Fellowship & Caring committee will provide fellowship following service.

Shared Ministry Covenant. Tabled until December Joint Council meeting.

Puppet Service. Service planned for 1.28.24

**Winter Bingo.** Event planned for 2.3.24. Members from both Grace and First Lutheran will create a committee for the event.

#### New Business.

**Oshkosh Conference.** Heidi Schramer and De Anna Lueptow will attend the conference assembly, representing our congregation. The event will be at Grace Church in Ripon on 10.22.23.

**Synod Webinar on 10.10.23.** Webinar topic will include church finances and stewardship. Pastor Rebekah will send a link to members.

**Annual Meeting.** Discussion on scheduling the meeting. Date set for 2.4.24, following service.

**Christmas Services Survey.** Results from the survey include, holding an 8:30 am on Christmas Eve Day (1), holding both Christmas Eve Day 8:30 am service and 4:00 pm evening service (14) and holding only a Christmas Eve Service at 4:00 pm (23). Per results of the survey, we will have one service on Christmas Eve, 12.24.23 at 4:00 pm.

**Damascus Road Project.** Discussion held on potential support of this project. Will table this item until our next meeting to allow time for members to review the information, and seek congregational input.

**Nominating Committee.** Discussion held on upcoming council member elections on 2.4.24. A total of six offices will be up for re-election in 2024, including the executive offices of the President, Vice President, and Treasurer. Non-officer positions up for re-election include a representative from Mission and Outreach, Christian Education, and a Music and Worship Liaison. Bill Bartlett, Linda Reetz, Michelle Klawitter and Ken Peschke are the members of the nominating committee. Pastor Rebekah also voiced a suggestion of nominating and electing two people to attend the synod assembly and two people for the conference assembly.

#### **Committee Reports.**

Pastor's Report. Pastor Rebekah initiated her report by expressing her Thanks to everyone for the Pastor Appreciation Day cards, she stated she was brought to tears by the outpouring of gratitude given by the congregation. Her regular report included in the official acts, communion for June Lubbert. The many ongoing activities at Grace included; weekly sermon preparations, weekly text study, weekly confirmation preparations and teachings, and Soul Food devotions. Wrote the newsletter article, wrote letters for All Saints Sunday, the quarterly giving statements and the Christmas services survey. Participated in webinars on the Gospel of Mark, and the Storytelling of the Seasons; Advent, Christmas and Epiphany. Attended council meetings. Met weekly with staff, including Jessica to reformat the bulletins, researched administrative software, met with the worship committee, researched Advent candle lighting liturgies and music.

**Buildings and Grounds.** Bob Prellwitz reported that work completed includes; lawn and shrub maintenance, furnace filter maintenance, picture hanging in Jessica's office, toilet repair, and Pickleball courts outlining. Upcoming work includes; lawn maintenance and fall clean-up, the hanging of the Drawn to the Word painting, the repair of choir loft ceiling cracks, and paint touch up as needed. Winter prep work includes; weather stripping, entryway radiator service, snowblower servicing, and lot snow plowing will be completed by Scott Dutcher. Also looking at blacktop seal coating next year. Next meeting 12.11.23.

**Christian Education.** Sue Shemanski reported that the October 15th Community Tailgate Party Event is set. The event will run from 3-5pm and includes food, games of pickleball, ball toss, pumpkin bowling and cornhole. There will be pumpkin painting and a selfie booth, along with devotions. Another upcoming event planned by the group is the Advent Family Event on November 29th from 5:30-7pm. The next meeting is 11.6.23.

Fellowship and Caring. Jody Ziemann reported that the group met yesterday, following service. The committee will provide fellowship following the Ecumenical Service. Tricia Prellwitz has coordinated volunteers for homebound visitations, with volunteers reporting concerns to Pastor. De Anna continues to work on creating a welcoming 'protocol and practice' for new members. Our committee has been made aware of members that are in need due to medical crises. As written in the church constitution, it is one of the committee's responsibilities "to provide and solicit assistance for members in need". Committee members spoke to a family representative of one member, they encouraged the committee to wait for intervention until more definitive information is known about the crisis. We spoke directly to the other member afflicted with a health crisis, we requested the individual to create a list of items needed to better meet their needs. Individual committee members offered to purchase gift cards for immediate needs. Discussion held on creating a place within the church to store essential household and hygiene items for church families in need. This designated storage place will be known as 'Grace's Caring Closet.' We will also reach out to the congregation, seeking help, and to join with us in this new Fellowship and Caring endeavor. Our group will provide fellowship following the Cantata Service on December 17th. We will also make treats for homebound members on December 17th and have our December meeting that day. The next meeting will be 11.12.23 following service.

Worship and Music. Pastor Rebekah reported that the group is planning for a Blue Christmas Service on December 17th at 6:30pm. The group is looking to plan for the Lenten Season with Ash Wednesday on February 14th. Pastor also reported that the group is working to solve technical difficulties with Facebook live streaming of services. The radio ministry broadcast recording is also completed through Facebook. The group is looking to Utube live and other web channels to update and ensure the best coverage. Congregational members are able to access live streaming of services on Grace's website.

**Mission and Outreach.** Craig Chovanec reported that the mission cause for October is Lutheran Social Services (LSS). Lutheran Social Services traces its roots back to 1882 when Pastor E.J.Homme founded a home for orphaned children in Wittenberg, WI. In 1963 Homme Home merged with Martin Luther social services, a

Lutheran Welfare Society. The agency has grown to be one of the largest faith based human service providers in the Midwest. LSS offers a variety of services throughout Wisconsin and Upper Michigan. They provide services that address a variety of conditions for children, families, adults, the elderly, and people with disabilities. Services are available to all regardless of religious affiliation. LSS offers services in 614 communities, touching 20,000 lives annually. Thank You for your generous support of this worthy cause.

Motion made by Jody Ziemann to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Cindy Wallace, motion carried.

#### Constitution Corner

Our congregation has a constitution, that in addition to the Bible, serves to guide our life together as a church. This constitution reflects the theology and polity of this church as it organizes itself to preach the gospel of Jesus Christ, share the sacraments, reach out to the neighbor with good news, and share the love of God in the world. Each month we plan to highlight a part of our constitution. The full constitution is found under resources on the website.

In addition to the church council, there are several committees that carry out various functions of the congregation. These are described in chapter 13 of the constitution and include the following:

Nominating Committee of four to six voting members of this congregation, two of whom, if possible, shall be outgoing members of the Congregation Council, shall be elected at the annual meeting for a term of one year. The Pastor(s) shall not be a part of the Nominating Committee. The responsibilities of the Nominating Committee shall include: Assist in discovering and enlisting members to fill leadership positions within the church. Present the names of volunteers to be elected by church voting members to the Congregation Council. Coordinate the filling of any vacancies of volunteers and leaders that may occur during the year.

*Audit Committee* of three voting members shall be elected by the Congregation Council. Audit Committee members shall not be members of the Congregation Council. Term of office shall be three years, with one member elected each year. Members shall be eligible for re-election.

*Finance Committee* with a minimum of 4 members, plus council treasurer work to monitor and evaluate the financial condition and operations of Grace English Lutheran Church and to bring to the Church Council's attention any identified areas for improvement or concern.

*Investment Committee* a minimum of 4 members, plus council representative manage investments on behalf of this congregation.

*Mission and Outreach Committee* a minimum of 4 members, plus council representative coordinate local, national, and international mission work by providing information and resources and to oversee and coordinate Church-wide mission work

Fellowship and Caring Committee a minimum of 4 members, plus council representative work to build a caring community that will help and support each of our members as we experience the events, stages and transitions of life. Building and Grounds Committee a minimum of 4 members, plus council representative oversee all activities associated with the operation, maintenance, safety and security of all buildings, grounds, furnishings and equipment owned by the church, except items expressly the responsibility of another committee.

*Christian Education Committee* a minimum of 4 members, plus council representative guide the educational ministry of the church by providing and supporting the children's Sunday School, confirmands, youth group, adult education, and intergenerational activities.

**The** *Endowment Ministry Committee* consists of five elected members with staggered three-year terms. The EMC manages the endowment fund which is a restricted segregated bookkeeping account of this congregation.

#### **Proposed Bylaw for Constitution**

The church council is recommending the adoption of the following bylaw to our constitution. This will be voted on at the annual meeting February 4, 2024.

**C12.01.04** In the event Grace English Lutheran Church is serving as a teaching congregation, the purpose of the learning experience is for the intern pastor to grow and develop their overall pastoral identity and experience all of the roles of being a pastor including participation in Congregation Council meetings. The intern pastor is expected to ask questions, offer input, and engage in discussion with council members. While the intern pastor has voice privileges, the intern does not have the ability to vote.

### A Member In Need - GoFundMe

Kelly Boening, a young mother of three, has been diagnosed with stage 2 pancreatic cancer. As this has been found in the early stage it can be beaten but the treatment is super aggressive and has taken a toll on her physically, mentally, and financially. She had to stop working as the chemo takes every ounce of energy from her. In the first month she has lost 50 pounds.

As mentioned, Kelly is a mother of three. She has been raising Allison for the past 9 years. Allison was abandoned when Kelly took her in caring for her, loving her, and buying everything she needed. In December of 2022, Kelly opened up her home and heart to two of Allison's half siblings, a 19-month old girl and a first grade boy. They came with only the clothes on their backs. Little Hazel was undernourished, couldn't talk or walk and Kelly has nurtured her, bringing out a bubble, happy little girl who likes to be silly and is walking and starting to talk. Kelly made sure MJ was enrolled in school and bought him school supplies and winter clothing to get him through first grade. He is thriving in school and is doing well. Kelly had been able to work and care for them until this devasting diagnosis of pancreatic cancer.

Some financial help is coming for the children but in the meantime every bill has fallen behind. Every ounce of energy Kelly has is used to make sure the kids have what they need from day to day. So far the GoFundMe page has helped pay her lot rent, so she did not lose her place in the trailer park.

She can't even begin to think of a happy holiday season for the children as day-to-day financial woes take precedence. Would you consider helping Kelly and her family?


### Grace Church Is Hosting The Next Blood Drive On Tuesday, January 2, 2024
