President Linda called the meeting to order at 7:01pm.

Opening Devotion. Terry.

Roll Call. Present; Linda Reetz, Terry Wallace, Sandy Peschke, Becky Olsen, Pastor Rebekah, Jody Ziemann (late), Craig Chovanec,

Anita Lind, Heidi Schramer. Absent; Bob Prellwitz.

Approval of Agenda. Motion made by Craig, seconded by Anita, motion carried.

No audience remarks.

Secretary's Report. September meeting minutes circulated via email. Motion made by Anita to accept the report as written, seconded by Terry, motion carried.

Treasurer's Report. Sandy presented the report including the check detail. Discussion held. Motion made by Anita to accept the reports as written, seconded by Terry, motion carried.

President's Report.

Safety Plan. Linda reported that the safety plan draft has been given to Ryan Dobbs for review. When returned, the council will have further discussion. Linda also indicated that a safety team will be created once the plan is completed.

Christmas Services. Christmas Eve service at Grace will be at 4pm, and at First will be 630pm.

Committee 2025 budgets requested to the office by 11.1.24. Finance committee will then review.

History Binder. Linda has compiled a binder of documents following the 'split'. The binder is located in the office.

Pastor's Report.

Accomplishments/Activity Highlights. Hosted the Oshkosh Conference pastors gathering and worship, met with a Lutheran World Relief representative for updates. Attended various leadership and committee meetings, attended various church activities and sporting events for congregation youth. Lead the Funding Forward course and teaching confirmation. Participated in the installation of Pastor Tews at St. Andrew's in Oshkosh, and attended the 150th Anniversary at St. John's in Eau Claire. Met with a family for funeral planning and continue to visit homebound members.

Priorities for the next period. Oshkosh Conference Assembly on October 19th. Preparing sermons for the community Thanksgiving services, working with Jessica on upcoming services including; All Saints, Veterans Recognition, Thankoffering, Advent and the Christmas season.

Challenges/Roadblocks. I'm still processing the healing circle experience.

Lessons Learned/Opportunities for Improvement. I found the exercise in the Funding Forward course on the history of Grace helpful in hearing more about chapters of history. I also found it insightful for us to identify how God was at work in each of these chapters of history.

Committee Reports.

Buildings and Grounds. Bob provided a written report. Security System estimate bid is \$6,269, no action taken. The Safety Plan recommendation from the Buildings and Grounds Committee is to go with the shorter, more concise version. Furnace filters were changed and the thermostat is set to heat mode. Stump removal from the south island was addressed, a replacement tree has been donated by a member, and will be planted when possible. Cobwebs will be removed, fall cleanup will be completed and preparation has begun for winter weather. Next meeting 12.9.24 at 1800.

Christian Education. Anita reported that Sunday School is going well, kids are enjoying the addition of music with Caelyn and Carissa Fritz. An interactive Advent Event will be Sunday, 12.1, following service, the Wreath making will be for all members. The Christmas Program will be held December 22nd. 'Once Upon a Manger', a paper bag interactive program including kids and adults. Next meeting 10.27, following service.

Fellowship and Caring. Jody reported that the committee will be serving Fellowship on 11.10, and making goodie plates for homebound members. The group is also planning to make cookie plates for homebound members in December. Next meeting will be 12.22, following service.

Worship and Music. Heidi reported upcoming Services to include; All Saints Service 11.3, Veterans Recognition Service with guest speaker Reverend Peter Muschinske 11.10, Women's Thankoffering Service 11.24, Thanksgiving Service at River Shores 11.26 at 7pm, Cantata Service 12.15, 'Once Upon a Manger' Service 12.22, Blue Christmas Service 12.22 at 630pm. Christmas Eve Service 12.24 at 4pm, and Puppet Ministry Service (joint service with potluck following) on 2.9.25. Live streaming of services will now be on YouTube, and a link will be provided. A slide will be created to assist members with newsletters and E-news mailings for church information. If you have questions regarding the technology please contact the office. The handbells and some music will be moved to the upper sacristy to provide additional storage space for current music. The group will work on updating the bulletin board with current photos, and work continues on creating a master list of Worship tasks/duties. Next meeting TBA.

Mission and Outreach. Craig reported that the mission cause for October is the Fellowship of Christian Athletes. This sports ministry began in 1954, touching lives all over the world. This international organization serves in 114 countries. The powerful platform of sports is used to reach athletes and connect them to Jesus Christ. Athletes at all levels are part of the FCA; pro, college, high and jr. high schools and youth. Values of integrity, service and teamwork are emphasized along with honoring Jesus in all we do. Programs include daily meetings, devotionals, team building and bible study. Connecting with young people is a way for our church to survive going forward. The committee will be finalizing its 2025 Mission Causes soon. Craig also stated that hurricane relief may be a mission at the start of the year, as the affected will have needs for a long time to come.

Finance Committee Report 09-17-24. Terry provided the following report.

1. It was decided that any expenses connected to the Christian Ed fund should be taken from that fund rather than the General fund.

2. The Budget vs. Actual Report was presented by Sandy with changes recommended at the last meeting.

3. Discussed moving the \$11,671 from the capital improvement fund into the new operating fund. At the last congregational council meeting there was approval given to create a new fund through RBC that would be an interest bearing account and also would be able to have those dollars easily accessible. Until the approved council minutes have been received, the account cannot be set up. The uncertainty right now centers around how to do the accounting procedures and maintaining a balance in the checking account. More discussion is needed. Currently nothing needs to be done with the \$11,671. It is not needed for operating expenses.

4. The premium notice for the church's insurance will be coming in November with the premium to be paid in December. There is a possibility that an increase of up to 40% might occur.

5. A 2025 health insurance update was provided. The church will provide Pastor Tarras the silver + plan through Portico.
Although her individual contribution will increase, the plan contains a health savings account which is an attractive benefit.
6. The RBC accounts continue to make gains. Investment decisions will need to be made in December when some CD's are maturing.

7. The next couple months will be spent creating a proposed 2025 budget. All church committees will be asked to submit their projected budget requests by November.

8. The next meeting has been set for October 15, 2024, at 1pm.

Investment Committee. A written report of the current investments was provided. The investments continue to show gains at this point.

Unfinished Business.

Council Terms Suggestions. Linda provided a list of three possible options for changing term limits for the office of President and Vice President. Discussion held. Motion made by Becky to keep term limits for the offices of President and Vice President as presently defined in the constitution, seconded by Anita, motion carried.

New Business.

Finance Committee's Recommendation for Creation of a New Account. Terry provided an explanation of transferring a portion of funds from the current checking account into some type of investment account. Terry stated that this would provide a potential way to manage our money and earn interest that we cannot on a traditional checking account. The funds would be derived from the present accounts of the Women of Grace, Christian Education Fund, Soul Food, and the Men of Grace. At this time, there is no set amount of funds to be transferred into this unnamed account. Motion made by Terry to

transfer an unknown amount of funds from the checking account into some type of an unnamed investment account, seconded by Craig, motion carried.

Church Insurance. Terry reported that he has received two quotes from potential new insurance agencies, he is awaiting a third quote. No decision made. Will further discuss at the November meeting.

Tree in the Park. Discussion held. Linda and Heidi will lead the decorating of a tree and will ask for more volunteers. **Audit Committee.** Linda reported that one member will need to be added to the committee before our yearly auditing of accounts.

Scholarship Committee. Linda will check with Diane to ensure what is needed for the committee.

Dollar Transfer Error. Linda reported that an error was completed in decision making at the September council meeting. Per the Capital Improvement Fund's definition, funds cannot be transferred and utilized for general operating expenses. Motion made by Terry to reconsider the moving of the \$11,671 from the Capitol Improvement Fund into a new unnamed operating account, seconded by Becky, motion carried.

Closing Prayer. Provided by Pastor Rebekah

Adjournment. Motion made by Craig to adjourn, seconded by Jody, motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 8:28pm.

Constitution Corner

In this month's Constitution Corner, we explore *C2.02a, which defines a foundational aspect of our faith:

*C2.02.a. Jesus Christ is the Word of God incarnate, through whom everything was made and through whose life, death, and resurrection God fashions a new creation.

At the heart of this statement is the declaration that Jesus Christ is the Word of God incarnate. This reminds us that the Jesus we know and worship is not only a historical figure but also the living presence of God in the world. As John 1:14 tells us, "The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us." Through Jesus, God became truly human, experiencing life with us and revealing God's character in a deeply personal way.

Furthermore, it is through Jesus' life, death, and resurrection that God is at work, fashioning a new creation. This new creation is not only the hope of the future but also a present reality, unfolding through the Gospel's power in the lives of believers. In this new creation, the brokenness of our world is healed, relationships are restored, and we are invited to live in the light of God's love and grace.

C2.02a encourages us to remember that everything was made through Christ. From the very beginning of creation to the renewal of the world, Jesus stands at the center of God's plan. As a congregation, we are called to live out this confession, sharing the good news of salvation with all and participating in God's work of renewal.

Let us be bold in proclaiming Jesus Christ as the living Word and in witnessing to the transformative power of the Gospel in our lives and in our community.

Reverse Advent Calendar

What is a reverse advent calendar? Traditionally, Advent calendars are used to count down the days of Advent in anticipation of Christmas. In church, we celebrate weekly the themes of Hope, Peace, Love, and Joy as we anticipate God's gift of Jesus. Traditional Advent calendars consist of a series of doors or windows to open, revealing a picture, a scripture verse, a small chocolate, or a little gift for each day.

But the Reverse Advent Calendar is different! Instead of receiving a daily gift, those taking part in a reverse calendar **DONATE** an item each day, thus giving instead of receiving. This year I'd like to encourage you to participate by following this list of food items to donate to our Food Pantry.

You can also do this in a different way. It doesn't have to be food that you are donating. Maybe put \$1 in a basket each day for your reverse advent calendar and then donate the money to our Food Pantry or World Hunger. It is also completely fine to add an item every few days or weekly instead of daily. No matter how you choose to participate, consider doing something small for those in need this Advent season. We are blessed to be a blessing to others as we celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ.

Put your food items in a box or bag that can be plain or decorated. You can bring the food items to church weekly or wait until Christmas Eve whichever works best for you. We will have a table in the fellowship room for donations.

Family Event: Advent Wreath Making

The Christian Education Committee of Grace will be sponsoring an Advent Wreath making Event on the first day of Advent, December 1, 2024, immediately after the 8:30 Sunday Worship Service.



Participants will be given the option of making a fresh pine wreath or an upcycled wreath. The wreaths will be able to be taken home that day and Brunch will be served by the Committee during the event.
