From the Pastor:

As I drove through downtown Berlin this morning, workers were hanging Christmas wreaths, the park is filled with trees in preparation for the lighting and holiday parade, and many yards are filled with Christmas decorations. The words "It's beginning to look a lot like Christmas..." are stuck in my head.



But, in the Church calendar, we aren't there yet. First, we have the season of Advent, a season of waiting. Do you remember as a kid having to wait to open presents on Christmas? It felt like torture seeing gifts under the tree with my name on them but having to wait and wait and wait to be able to open them. Sometimes this time of waiting for the coming of Christ feels like that – like we are waiting forever. During Advent we are waiting both for the celebration of Christ's arrival on earth in human form as the baby Jesus but also for his arrival that is yet to occur. It is this strange time of already and not yet.

The tone of the readings in our Advent worship are of longing and preparing for the coming of Christ. As the body of Christ, we carry different longings. What were the deep longings stirring in the hearts of the original hearers of Luke's gospel? What did they expect from the promised Messiah? A conquering king? A mighty warrior? An avenger? What are the longings in our lives today? How are we preparing for Christ's coming?

Advent invites us to enter into this time of waiting in hope: for peace, for joy, for the restoration of all that is broken, for the fulfillment of all things in Christ. While waiting is often a challenge for us, we can use this time to prepare our hearts and our minds for the coming of Christ.

I encourage you to do something intentional in this season that will help you prepare for the coming of Christ both at Christmas and when he comes again. You might consider using an Advent calendar with daily readings; an Advent devotion book to guide you through this season of waiting; or refresh your view of Jesus by reading one chapter in the Gospel of Luke every day of December. Here are some free Advent resources to explore:

REGULAR GRACE ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH CONGREGATIONAL COUNCIL MEETING – FELLOWSHIP HALL Monday, October 11, 2021

Present: Bill Bartlett, Cindy Wallace, Matt Dretske, Tricia Prellwitz, Becky Guden, Sue Shemanski; Karen Macaulay; Pastor Rebekah Tarras. Linda Reetz and Conrad Falk were absent.

President Bill Bartlett called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and Pastor Rebekah led us in an opening devotion and prayer.

The September Council minutes were presented. Cindy Wallace made a motion to accept the minutes; Sue Shemanski seconding the motion. Motion approved.

Ministry Reports:

Pastor Rebekah presented her written report and highlighted that she did have two funerals so far in October. In September she did five homebound visits with communion; plus other hospital visits and phone calls. Pastor also was busy planning and conducting Confirmation Classes; Bible Studies; various committee meetings; synod meetings and held her first high school youth study of this school year. She did note that she may be attending the Synod Fall Theological Retreat on October 25th to the 27th; has graciously accepted a Pieta sculpture and a wood table to be used in the narthex from the Sandy Krynik memorial. Grace sponsoring a Christmas Tree in the Nathan Strong Park was brought up and council agreed to take care of that. With all the duties Pastor Rebekah has between the two parishes, Tricia Prellwitz agreed to help organize lay persons to help with the homebound members which will include distribution of communion.

Cindy Wallace handed out the September Treasurer's Report and September Check Detail. Tricia Prellwitz made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report as presented; Matt Dretske seconded. Motion approved. After reviewing the list of September checks, Matt Dretske made a motion to approve checks as written; Tricia Prellwitz seconded. Motion approved.

The Investment profile spreadsheet was reviewed by Bill Bartlett. September was a down month but RBC advised not to worry as the market is recovering but to expect ups and downs in the next several months.

Matt Dretske presented the Buildings and Grounds Committee spreadsheet of projects and noted that edging along the sidewalks is completed and thanked Jim Lehr and Mark Labbus that helped. They have added some rocks in the landscaping with a member donating larger rocks from their land to hold the areas better. Also noted was that the carpet replacement around the altar will start this week.

Sue Shemanski from the Christian Education Committee reported that Sunday School has started with only a few attending. Bible distribution was held with 10 youth being invited and only 1 youth was present to receive their Bible.

Worship & Music Committee report was presented by Tricia Prellwitz and highlighted that the HOPE series went very good and was well received; training on the new audio/video technology is being held; Blue Christmas Service will be December 19 at night; Christmas Cantata will be December 19 with a public presentation on December 15; a 4:30pm Christmas Eve service is being planned for December 24; currently working on updating the Wedding Booklet; and celebrating members 80+ years will be planned for a Sunday in June.

Karen Macaulay advised that the Caring & Sharing group will be making gnomes after the service on November 7 to be distributed to the homebound members.

There was no Mission Report; no other concerns brought to the council and no member audience.

Old Business:

It was noted that a Building Usage form has been completed and on file by the person using our facility; and all church personnel are aware of this form.

Tricia Prellwitz advised that All Saints Sunday, October 31 will be also Don Timm Recognition Sunday to honor all his wood mosaic contributions he had donated to Grace. His family has been invited to attend and participate in the service.

Soul Food was discussed with only Grace and River Shores congregations participating to date. Council will urge to start this program even though it is just the two churches and they may have to host twice a month. If other church(es) come forward to participate, the frequency to host can be adjusted.

Council discussed current COVID procedures and agreed to remain with current policy. Congregation has requested more singing since the majority have been vaccinated, but council understands the current county number of cases is high and we have to remain patient. Council will keep an eye on the status.

New Business:

As Tricia Prellwitz had previously reported, the Worship & Music Committee will be working on a special Sunday service in June to honor all members that are of 80 years and older. They would like to include pictures in a slideshow presentation and interviews. A subcommittee will be formed to start the planning process and gathering of items.

The Tentmakers organization was discussed whether or not Grace should participate. Sue Shemanski made a motion to pursue, gather more information, start educating the congregation on what this program is and advise Tentmakers that Grace may request a team for the 2022 program. Cindy Wallace seconded. Motion approved.

Pastor Rebekah led council in Closing Prayer.

Tricia Prellwitz made a motion to adjourn; Matt Dretske seconded. Motion approved. Meeting adjourned at 8:40 p.m.

Spattered with rain and icy cold, the glass around the church door frame told of a blustery day that would be better spent inside. A good day for exploring, I thought, or maybe for nestling into a quiet corner for a nap. In one of the storage areas, I skirted around boxes and bins in the warmth of the enclosure, looking for a cozy spot...when suddenly I came to a halt by a little painted figure of baby Jesus. Not yet placed in the creche that graces the narthex at Christmas time, he looked so tiny and alone.

My memory took me back to last year and the table of sculpted characters that surrounded the baby. I remembered Mary and Joseph, an angel, a shepherd, kings and animals. They must be packed somewhere nearby. But seeing the tiny Jesus, all alone, brought to mind the fact that he started life as a helpless baby, needing love and care, nourishment and a name. Just like you and I did. As with ordinary people and animals, Jesus had to grow and mature and, with the help of his earthly family, learn to take care of himself and live among others. In many ways, he was like the rest of us on earth.

Because I pay attention during the services here at Grace, I know that the story of the life of Jesus continues through the years he devoted to teaching and healing. I also know that he encountered problems along the way. In the soft light of the storage room, perched alongside this little figure of baby Jesus, there was suddenly something very comforting about the realization that even he must have known the hardships of this life on earth.

Like me, he probably knew what it's like to be hungry, cold, lonely, and lost. But he also knew in his heart that God was always watching over him. He could turn to his heavenly father in prayer, he could cry out to him in pain, and he could praise and thank him for blessings. He could count on God's faithful presence. Instantly I felt a little less alone. I fell asleep soundly, curled up against the cradle of baby Jesus.

It must be nearing the time that we will hear the Christmas story once again at Grace. In fact, I've heard it will be told in music as well, in two cantata performances. The women of Grace are planning an Advent Brunch to celebrate the birth of Jesus, and Pastor Rebekah will be leading a workshop for all who struggle with sadness at a time when they wish to feel joy. The people of Grace are working to make Christmas a time for everyone, not just for the joyful but for the lonely and the lost as well.

I look forward to seeing baby Jesus laid in the manger, surrounded by the figures who welcomed him to this earth. I'm going to pause before it often to ponder the story. I'm sure many of you will, too. After all, the story is for every one of us.
