Grace Lutheran's Mission: We Gather to Worship, Grow, Care, and Share "All Are Welcome In This Place"

What is Grace?

Spiritually speaking, grace is defined as the free and unmerited favor of God.

Scripture teaches that the "wages of sin is death". But that is not what we receive. The apostle Paul writes in Romans 3:23 "we have all sinned and fallen short of God's hopes for us, but we don't receive death we receive God's grace." John 3:16 tells us that God so loved the world that he gave his only Son so that whoever believes in him may not perish but have eternal life."

Grace is God's Gift of love! It is undeserved, unearnable, unrepayable. It is God's gift freely given with no strings attached. (*read that again*).

According to the Bible, Grace is the nature of God. We often talk about humans seeking God, but how opposite that is to what the scriptures tell us. God seeks us! Consider these examples:

- In Genesis, after Adam and Eve eat of the fruit they hide from God. God comes looking for them, calling out "Adam & Eve, where are you?"
- Abraham and Sarah were called by God, not vice versa. (Can you imagine 2 old folks wishing to become first time parents? They were chosen by God to be the parents of God's chosen people.)
- Then there is Moses to whom God speaks from a burning bush.
- And it's not just in the OT, in the early part of the gospels, Jesus called out to Peter and Andrew, 2 fishermen picked off the beach, chosen to follow Jesus, to come as you are.
- The apostle Paul was blinded by the light of God on the Damascus road and called to be an apostle on mission for Jesus.
- God's nature is to love us no matter what we do just like the prodigal father.
- We hear it in the Christmas story, God sent his Son.
- And ultimately there is the crucifixion and resurrection! God was willing to go all the way to pay for our sins through the crucifixion of his son and offers eternal life through the resurrection.

The apostle Paul wrote in Romans 5:6-8 that at the "right time," while we were still weak and lost in our sin, Christ died for us. In this crazy way, God "proves his love for us!"



This is the framework for everything else we say and do and are. God was willing to go all the way to the cross to pay for our sins and offers us eternal life by his resurrection. This is the nature of God. God loves you! Christ died for you! There is no other message.

God's grace also gives us the power to love others and to share the message of God's love with others. We can be so confident in God's love and grace that we are able to try new things and welcome new people and embrace new ideas and dream new dreams.

We are saved by God's grace, as a gift, through our faith in the one who came down to set us free and not because of a single thing we have ever said or thought or done. We are here because of God's unconditional love in Jesus Christ. If we realize we are the lost sheep that the shepherd left the other 99 to go and find, when we are found and restored, then we know the results of God's grace.

As God's people we have been set free through Jesus, from sin, from death, and all the other rotten stuff that messes up our lives – that doesn't mean the struggle is over, but it does mean that every day we have a chance to start over, to remember our baptism and God's grace. We are saved, we are loved, and we are set free.

So let's be people of Grace.

GRACE ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING 3.13.23

Council members present; Heidi Schramer, DeAnna Lueptow, Cindy Wallace, Becky Olsen, Pastor Rebekah, Intern Kathy, Sue Shemanski, Lisa Lee, Bob Prellwitz, Jody Ziemann and Craig Chovanec

President Heidi Schramer called to order at 7:05 pm Opening Prayer led by DeAnna Lueptow

Approval of Agenda, motion made by Sue Shemanski to approve agenda as written, seconded by Jody Ziemann, motion carried No concerns from audience

Secretary's Report February council meeting minutes offered. Motion made by Cindy Wallace to accept report as written, seconded by Craig Chovanec, motion carried Treasurer's Report Cindy Wallace presented the February report, members reviewed. Motion made by Jody Ziemann to accept report as written, seconded by DeAnna Lueptow, motion carried. February check detail report reviewed, motion made by Sue Shemanski to approve all checks as written, seconded by Jody Ziemann, motion carried.

Old Business Joint Council meeting with Grace and First Lutheran's executive board is Tuesday March 21st, 6:30pm, hosted by Grace. Fellowship hall bulletin board discussion, committees have agreed to decorate boards, highlighting their respective committee's work and involvement. Samaritan Fund discussion tabled until April meeting.

New Business Jessica Fritz presented information on a performance concert by the contemporary Christian group Selah. The concert would be held at Grace, lasting approximately 1 ½-2 hours, tentative date of November 4, 2023. Approximate cost of the event is \$8500.00, with additional costs of airfare, hotel rooms, and meals. Following a lengthy discussion on needs and tasks to be completed to host this event, Jody Ziemann made a motion to designate \$5000.00 to host the Selah concert, motion seconded by Lisa Lee, motion carried. Funds for the event will be derived from the church general fund.

Information shared and discussion on Grace sponsoring a container house ('pod') for Turkey earthquake survivors. The request for assistance came from Lutheran World Relief. Turkey Disaster Relief is our mission of the month for March. The total cost of the container house is \$5300.00. Sue Shemanski made a motion to have the church match a dollar to dollar fundraising campaign by the congregation up to \$2650.00, seconded by Craig Chovanec, motion carried. Fundraising will continue until the congregation raises the \$2650.00. Funds will be derived from the general fund.

Discussion on hosting a "Drawn to the Word", a painting of scripture lesson during a special service. Cost of the event is \$4,625.00 or \$3,850 if wooden frame and stretching of canvas is completed by the congregation. Motion made by Sue Shemanski to allocate up to \$4625.00 for the event, seconded by Lisa Lee, motion carried. Funds will be derived from the general fund.

Committee Reports Pastor's Report. Pastor Rebekah reported on her past months' pastoral acts including a baptism at First Lutheran, and pastoral visits included visits with June Lubbert and Joby Zietlow. In addition to pastoral acts she provided the council with an extensive list of activities completed and ongoing for both Grace and 1st Lutheran churches.

Investment Profile Update. Report presented by Cindy Wallace. No questions regarding profile. Bill Bartlett will continue to generate the monthly report for the council.

Building and Grounds. Bob Prellwitz reported that there had been a leak from the roof near the baptismal font. Water was noted to be on one day only, following a warming trend and may be an ice jam, will continue to monitor and address if further leakage. Marten's Heating and Cooling will conduct annual furnace and air conditioner checks and cleaning. 5 of the 6 furnaces require heat exchanger replacement, the parts are warranted, we would be responsible for the labor. Bathroom faucet near the choir room has been repaired. Jackson Glass has been contacted regarding door repairs, no return calls as of our meeting tonight. Committee continues to complete much snow removal. Bulletin board is complete. Cobwebs will be addressed, awaiting new kneelers, painting in the sanctuary will be completed after new kneeler installation. Next meeting 4.10.23 at 6pm.

Christian Education. Sue Shemanski reported that the Mardi Gras event was well received with 35 attendees. Sunday School has two new participants. The group will start a 4yr old class this fall! A sports themed Vacation Bible School is planned for July 11-13th, from 5:30-7:30pm, starting with a supper at 5:30pm. Bulletin board work is ongoing.

Fellowship and Caring. Jody Ziemann reported that the group met on Sunday to finalize Palm Sunday brunch plans. Sign up sheets for congregation donations are on the kiosk, sheets have also been sent to 1st Lutheran. Members will meet on Saturday April 1st at 9am to set up the fellowship hall and start food prep. Upcoming events include a Mothers Day or other Spring project. Next meeting is 4.16.23, following worship service.

Worship and Music. Lisa Lee presented an in depth report of the upcoming music schedule through May. Jess is planning for the summer music schedule. A special cross presentation will be offered during Good Friday Service. Communion will be offered every Sunday following Palm Sunday. Upcoming events include; a Polka Service at the end of August. The 'Drawn to the Word' painting presentation on 9.24.23. The Selah concert is tentatively booked for Saturday, 11.4.23. Jess continues to look for and plan alternate service events. Discussion on donating old kneelers to rummage sale if new arrive prior to the sale. Group will work on the bulletin board. Next meeting will be after Easter.

Mission and Outreach. Craig Chovanec reported that the group completed their third and final Ding Dong Dinner event yesterday, this delivery was made to more random people in various sections of town, random congregational members also took dinners for delivery. Members will think about how to get more people involved next year, and they would also like to get youth involved in this mission. The group delivered approximately 150 meals over three months! Thrivent cards offered were very helpful in defraying cost. The March mission of the month is Disaster Relief and plans are in place to fundraise for the building of a container house for Turkey's earthquake survivors. Bulletin board display is up focusing on our monthly missions. April's mission of the month will be Crossways, Craig is gathering information, Carrie McCarthy will provide the congregation presentation.

Next council meeting is planned for Monday, April 10th at 7pm. Intern Kathy led closing prayer Adjournment motion made by Cindy Wallace, seconded by Sue Shemanski, motion carried.
